

Arriving in Toronto

Toronto Pearson International Airport

GENERAL INFORMATION

Toronto Pearson International Airport is located about 22 km northwest of downtown Toronto and is Canada's largest airport. It is serviced by over 65 airlines, including **Air Canada**, **American Airlines**, **Delta**, **United**, **US Airways**, and **WestJet**. Pearson offers a variety of ways to travel to downtown Toronto, including the **Union Pearson Express**, **taxi services**, and the **Toronto Transit Commission (TTC)**. THE UNION PEARSON EXPRESS

The **Union Pearson Express** train (**UP Express**) is a convenient and affordable way to travel directly from Pearson Airport to Union Station in downtown Toronto in **25 minutes**. The UP Express costs **\$12.35 per one-way ticket** and departs from the airport every 15 minutes. Tickets can be purchased online at upexpress.com, service counters or ticket vending machines. TAXIS AND LIMOUSINES

A **taxi** or **limousine** can drive you from Pearson to downtown Toronto for about **\$65**. Traffic and construction can be unpredictable, so the trip can take from **25 to 70 minutes** depending on the time of day. To take a taxi or limousine, go to one of the following designated pick-up locations:

TERMINAL 1: Taxicabs: Door D or Limousines: Door C

TERMINAL 3: Taxicabs: Doors D, E & F or Limousines: Doors C & D

THE AIRPORT ROCKET – TORONTO TRANSIT COMMISSION (TTC)

Use the TTC and take the **192 Airport Rocket** bus from Pearson to Kipling subway station for **\$3.25**. At Kipling, hop on the **Bloor-Danforth** subway heading east toward St. George. Transfer at St. George to the **Yonge-University** subway heading south towards Union Station. Please allow at least **75 minutes** for this trip.

Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport

GENERAL INFORMATION

Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport is located on the Toronto Islands, just a 5 minute ferry ride or pedestrian tunnel away from downtown Toronto. The airport is serviced primarily by regional airline **Porter Airlines** as well as a few **Air Canada** routes. Porter Airlines is a comfortable and reasonably-priced regional airline with service from **New York**, **Boston**, **Chicago**, **Washington** and more. COMPLIMENTARY SHUTTLE

Billy Bishop offers a **complimentary shuttle bus** between the airport and downtown Toronto. Hop on the bus just outside the airport's mainland ferry terminal; the bus will drop you off just past York and Front Street in the center of downtown Toronto, close to Union Station. TAXIS

If you'd like to take a taxi directly from Billy Bishop Airport to your final destination, they are available at the designated stands in front of the airport. Fares are standard, metered, non-negotiable and range from **\$8 to \$15 plus tip**.

Getting around Toronto

TAKE THE TTC

The **TTC** (or the **Toronto Transit Commission**) is Toronto's public transit system made up of subways, buses, and streetcars. Pay **\$3.25 per one-way fare** or **\$12.50 for a day pass** (which can be purchased in advance at all subway stations or participating TTC Fare Agents) to get just about anywhere in Toronto. There are two main subway lines: the Yonge-University line which runs from north to south and the **Bloor-Danforth** line which runs from east to west. The subway lines operate from 6 am (9 am on Sundays) until 1:30 am daily while streetcars and buses vary. Visit www.ttc.ca to view a map and plan your trip. CABS AND UBER

If you're willing to brave the traffic, hail a cab for a comfortable ride anywhere in the city. Cab fares are standard, metered, and non-negotiable.

WALKING AND BIKING

Toronto has a simple, grid-like layout and is a very walkable city. Alternatively, rent a bike from **Bike Share Toronto** stations across the city.
